The five pathways are as follows:

- Two-Year Time Frame (TYTF)
- One Year Residency (OYR)
- Accelerated Full Time and OYR
- Advanced Standing
- Dual Degree

- When you begin the program.
- When you start Field Placement.
- Which pathway grid you follow.
- What courses to register for.
- Required credits for your degree.
- When you submit Field paperwork.

METHODS

Your method informs your course of study in pursuing your MSW degree.

You take methods courses in addition to the general requirements all students must complete. You must also take them concurrent with your field placement.

A Field of Practice Specialization (FOPS), although not required, will equip you with an area of expertise that will enhance your MSW degree.

Requirements for completing and FOP Specialization:

- An appropriate second or residency (OYR) field practicum.
- A Professional Seminar (790) project and/or Research topic related to your FOP.
- At least one (1) elective option that falls under the FOP.

The capstone course for your MSW. You will prepare a paper or project that focuses on a practice or policy issue that matters to you.
